

ABOUT ENDURIS

Enduris is a member-owned, member-governed, and member-driven local government risk sharing pool for public entities in Washington. Enduris is committed to providing financial protection, broad coverage, and risk management services to its members. Its coalition of 507 diversified low-risk special purpose districts join together to meet their unique risk management and insurance needs. By blending the risk exposures of the diverse membership and combining the membership's total insured values, Enduris uses its massive purchasing power to secure reinsurance from the commercial market and passes the savings along to the individual members. As the risk management arm of its members, Enduris manages claims and provides a broad array of in-depth loss control services, training, and risk consultation. Overall, Enduris is more than just insurance, it's better government.





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MESSAGE TO THE MEMBERS

Policy Year (PY) 2015 was another positive year for Enduris (the Pool). The Policy Year ended on August 31, 2015 with over 500 members participating in the Pool with a total insured value of over \$2.7 billion. Enduris added another \$815,700 to net position to end the year with over \$32 million in combined assets. Risk pools in Washington State are regulated by the Department of Enterprise Services which requires that pools undergo a primary and secondary asset test to assess for financial solvency. Enduris passed both tests and is poised for another successful year in PY 2016. Please take a minute to read the financial note found in this Annual Report.

The staff at Enduris is looking forward to making PY 2016 another great year of assisting our members with their insurance needs. Our duty remains the same: to provide the highest level of coverage available in a competent, friendly, professional manner, and to encourage good risk management practices by the membership to manage and control claims and the cost of claims.

On the national stage Enduris is a well-recognized pool known for outside the box paradigm thinking and cutting edge enterprise risk management strategies to help keep costs low.

The upcoming year is our 29th year in operation and begins with an additional \$10 million in liability coverage, for a total of \$20 million per member, per occurrence, and at no additional cost to the membership. Property coverage continues to be replacement cost with \$1 billion limits per occurrence. In an increasingly litigious society and with reinsurance costs low, it was prudent to look at increasing the liability limits to meet the members' needs. Members can rest assured that they are provided the highest level of coverage should a claim occur.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Enduris promotes good risk management practices by partnering with Municipal Research Services Center (MRSC) and working with several risk management consultants as well as various member associations. The goal is to introduce to the membership risk management techniques that are cutting edge practices which help mitigate risks and contain the escalating cost of claims. An excellent example is in the Employment Liability arena where we partner with our members in the Pre-Defense program to avoid costly employment liability lawsuits. The PY 2015 claims audit notes that the program has contributed to a decrease in the frequency of incidents that develop into lawsuits, and it lowers the ultimate value of cases that do go into suit. This type of proactive approach to risk management benefits both the member and the Pool.

Local governments increasingly find it more difficult to deliver services with decreasing resources, relying on ingenuity to continue to do the work our communities expect. The Enduris staff takes a proactive approach to minimizing the impact of claims that could impact the delivery of services, by identifying risk trends and claim activity affecting our members. On the national stage Enduris is a well-recognized pool known for outside the box paradigm thinking and cutting edge enterprise risk management strategies to help keep members' costs low.

We thank each one of you for the trust, belief, and support you have given Enduris as a Member/Owner over the last 28 years and we look forward to serving you for many more years!



INTRODUCTION

Enduris (the Pool) presents this narrative overview and analysis of the financial activities of the Pool for the fiscal year (FY) ended August 31, 2015. When read in conjunction with the financial statements presented in this report, Enduris hopes to provide you with context and understanding of the operating environment of Enduris.

The Pool reports its activities as an enterprise fund. An enterprise fund is a proprietary fund, and as such uses full accrual accounting for its activities. Revenues are recognized when earned, and expenses are recognized when incurred.

Upon completion of our audit, performed by the Washington State Auditor's Office, the Pool's audited financial report and Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) will be posted to the Enduris website. We encourage you to refer to the CAFR which includes a detailed discussion and analysis, complete financial statements including notes to the financial statements, required supplementary information, and statistical ten-year trends.

NEW MEMBERS

Growth in the membership helps the Pool to diversify which promotes the spread of risk across many member types and locations. In FY 2015, the membership grew from 491 to 507. Members joining in FY 2015 were:

HIGHLIGHTS

- Enduris' overall financial position improved during FY 2015 with an \$815,686 increase in net position. This change represents a 6.3% increase from restated prior year net position.
- Enduris continues to meet the solvency standards established by Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 200-100-03001.
- Enduris, in total, outperformed compared to budget. Total revenues were 1.2% over budgeted revenues. Expenses were 2.4% under budget. Enduris contributed 8.3% of revenue to net position. It is Board policy to budget 5% of contribution revenue to net position annually.
- Enduris is funded in excess of the 97% confidence level as it relates to claim reserves.
- Enduris had 99.8% retention for the FY 2015 membership renewal. Over the last five years, Enduris has maintained average member retention of 99%.
- In FY 2015, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP), Enduris implemented the requirements of Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 68, *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions*. Statement No. 68 aims to improve the financial reporting for pensions by changing to an accounting methodology from a funding methodology. Statement No. 68 changes the way government entities calculate and report the costs and obligations of providing pension benefits to their employees. Government entities reporting on an accrual basis, like Enduris, are required to report on the face of their financial statements their proportionate share of the collective pension amounts. Enduris will recognize for the first time, in restated FY 2014, a net pension liability as well as deferred outflows and deferred inflows of resources related to pensions. Fiscal Year 2014 beginning net position has been restated by a decrease of \$1,269,579 and pension expense decreased by \$21,918. Please refer to our CAFR for detailed disclosures regarding this new reporting standard.






ASSETS

In total, FY 2015 assets increased 5.6% over FY 2014. Cash and cash equivalents are the Pool's principal assets. After making a significant investment in capital assets by constructing an office building, Enduris continues to build cash reserves. A strong cash flow is necessary to meet the Pool's regular financial obligations (claim payments, operating expenses), and is also required to meet the regulatory standards established by the State Risk Manager. The regulatory oversight include standards for solvency, operations and management, and require that risk pools maintain certain financial reserves in order to ensure that claims are funded.


Contribution receivables are down from FY 2014 as a result of the timing of payments from members for renewal invoices. The majority of the contribution receivables outstanding as of August 31 are paid in the month following the end of the fiscal year. Other receivables are copays/deductibles due from members for the member's share of claim costs, and recoverables due from excess carriers for claim costs above our Self-Insured Retention and subrogation due from at fault parties. Both these receivables fluctuate due to claim severity.



LIABILITIES

Enduris' main liabilities are claim reserves and unearned member contributions. Claim reserves are reserves for losses incurred but not reported (IBNR), open claims, and unallocated loss adjustment expenses (ULAE). The estimate for claim reserves is evaluated bi-annually by the Pool's actuary PricewaterhouseCoopers LLC (PwC). The estimate is based on several complex factors, and as such will vary. Unearned member contributions are contributions billed that will be recognized in the subsequent fiscal period. The Pool invoices members for member contributions in July for the policy year beginning September 1. After the restatement of FY 2014 for the implementation of GASB Statement No. 68, net pension liability increased by 25.6%. The collective net pension liability, as well as the collective deferred outflows/inflows of resources related to pensions, is provided by Washington State Department of Retirement Systems, and like claim reserves is based on several complex factors and will vary year to year. In total, liabilities of the Pool increased 6.7% over FY 2014.








NET POSITION

In keeping with Board policy, Enduris continues to budget 5% of contribution revenue to net position. Net position is also known as surplus or members' equity. As noted earlier, FY 2014 net position has been restated for the implementation of GASB Statement No. 68, resulting in a decrease from FY 2013. Fiscal year 2014, restated, contributed \$650,711 to members' net position and FY 2015 contributed \$815,686 to members' net position. Since FY 2005 when the policy was established by the Board, the Pool has successfully contributed 5% of contribution revenue to net position. Increasing net position helps the Pool keep rates stable and predictable by not subjecting the Pool to the fluctuations of the excess reinsurance market and unusual claim activity or severity.





CONTRIBUTIONS

Member contributions are the main source of operating revenue for the Pool. During FY 2015, total contribution revenue increased 8.0% over FY 2014. Addition of new members, as well as an overall 2.9% inflationary rate increase contributed to the increase in member contributions. We strive to mirror the rate of inflation in order to provide rate predictability to members and stability to the Pool.








EXPOSURES


Liability contributions are the product of members' exposures times rate. The exposures used by the Pool for calculating liability contributions are hours reported to the Department of Labor and Industries (L & I). These hours are used for all member types except fire districts. The Pool uses emergency runs for fire districts. The concept for the exposure base is simple - the number of worker hours/emergency runs represents a quantitative measure of risk. In total, exposures used for liability contributions increased for FY 2015, L & I hours increased 3.6%, and emergency runs increased 9.3%. Increases in liability exposures are attributed to new members.

TOTAL INSURED VALUE

Property contributions are a product of members' total insured value (TIV) times rate. Total insured values increased 6.2% over FY 2014. In addition to growth generated by adding new members as well as growth within existing membership, TIV is adjusted for inflation. Property is insured for replacement cost. To keep pace with inflation, a Marshall & Swift adjustment is applied to TIV annually, 3.88% for real property in FY 2015. Marshall & Swift is a leading provider of building cost data.

MAJOR EXPENSES BY CATEGORY


The Pool's major expense categories are incurred loss and allocated loss adjustment expenses (claim expense), excess insurance premiums, and administration expenses. Fluctuations in claim expense have the greatest financial impact on the Pool, affecting the allocation to net position (members' equity). As noted in the chart, there is an inverse relationship between claim expense and contribution to members' net position. Our operational expectation is that claim expense and excess insurance premiums are less than 75% of total operating expenses and for FY 2015 they were 68.6% of total expenses.

In total, expenses increased 5.7% over FY 2014. The increase in expenses is attributed to claim expense and excess insurance premiums. Coverage offered to the membership of Enduris is occurrence form. With occurrence form, claims can be filed and paid in the current year for incidents that "occurred" in prior years.

Fiscal year 2015 claim expense increased 5.8% over FY 2014. Claim expense includes indemnity, legal and file expenses as well as a provision for claims incurred but not reported (IBNR), net of expected recoveries. Overall liability claim costs have trended extremely favorable. Property claim costs have been trending higher than historical trends would suggest. Increases in claim expenses are not unexpected as we add new members to the Pool. Enduris' Self-Insured Retention (SIR), \$1,000,000 on liability losses and \$250,000 on property losses, contribute to greater fluctuation in claim costs. The Pool retains a greater share of the loss with less being shifted to the excess insurance carrier.

Enduris purchases excess insurance policies to reduce exposure to large losses. The cost the Pool pays to excess insurance carriers is based on L & I hours and emergency runs for liability coverage and TIV for property coverage. Loss history is also a factor. Fiscal year 2015 excess coverage insurance premiums increased 8.2% over FY 2014. The Pool experienced a slight decrease in liability excess coverage insurance premiums. Property excess coverage insurance premiums increased as a result of an increase in TIV and loss history.

Administration expenses increased 3.3% for FY 2015 over FY 2014. Administration expenses include payroll, broker fees, actuarial services, legal counsel, audit costs, MRSC access fees, and general office expenses such as travel, postage, utilities, marketing, etc. The increase in administration expenses is due mainly to an increase in the reserve for unallocated loss adjustment expenses and pre-defense costs.

COVERAGE

Enduris provides both liability and property coverage for the membership. The comprehensive coverage document, known as the Memorandum of Coverage (MOC), is occurrence form and reinsured with AM Best rated insurance providers. The majority of the limits and sub-limits on all lines of coverage are per member and not shared among other Pool members.

General Liability

The liability program offers specialized coverages based on members' needs. The liability package includes: General Liability, Auto Liability, Employment Practices Liability, Cyber Liability, and Public Officials Errors and Omissions.

Although a small number of members have a higher deductible, the majority of members have a \$1,000 deductible for liability coverage. Enduris' Self-Insured Retention (SIR) for liability loss is \$1 million. For PY 2015, losses over the SIR are covered by Enduris' reinsurance carriers up to \$10 million. We are excited to increase these limits to \$20 million beginning PY 2016.





Property

Enduris provides property coverage through the Alliant Property Insurance Program (APIP). The policy is "All Risk" providing members the broadest form of coverage with guaranteed replacement. The policy includes Boiler and Machinery, Crime, Cyber Coverage, and Auto Physical Damage (APD). Members generally have a \$1,000 deductible for basic property and contents loss, and a \$250 deductible for APD, although members may choose a higher deductible. Enduris' SIR for property loss is \$250,000.


Ancillary

Enduris assists members in obtaining specialty policies for their unique exposures known as Ancillary coverage. In PY 2015, 134 policies were secured for members such as: Airport Liability, Marina Operators Legal Liability, Pollution Liability, Railroad Liability, and more.


Enduris also procures \$25,000 Identity Fraud Expense Reimbursement coverage and Identity Fraud Resolution Services for all members. Fire districts also receive \$25,000 on-duty Accident and Health coverage.

CLAIMS REPORTED

Claims Reported represents the number of claims opened in a single year. Because Enduris policies are occurrence form, claims can be filed for losses that occurred in previous coverage years. In PY 2015, 223 claims were opened by Enduris. There were 76 Property claims, 76 Auto Physical Damage, 46 General Liability, 20 Auto Liability, and 5 Employment Practices Liability claims opened.







CLAIM COSTS

Claim Costs represent the total dollar amount paid by Enduris during the year. Like Claims Reported, Claim Costs do not consider the year in which the loss occurred, only the year in which the claim payment was made. In PY 2015 Enduris closed 181 claims. Claim Costs in PY 2015 totaled \$3,337,197. By lines of coverage, the costs were: \$1,318,844 Property, \$475,898 Auto Physical Damage, \$931,420 General Liability, \$125,527 Auto Liability, and \$485,508 Employment Practices Liability.

RISK MANAGEMENT

Enduris offers an array of risk management services designed to assist members with their exposures. The primary goal is to make every attempt to prevent losses before they occur. Services include but are not limited to:

- · Risk Management Consultation
- · Contract/Policy Review
- · Training and Education
- · MRSC
- · Pre-Defense Consultation

In PY 2015, Enduris staff responded to 325 member risk management inquires (including contract reviews) and offered 69 live risk management seminars. Additionally, Enduris members made 470 inquiries with MRSC and took advantage of 334 online training modules. The Pre-Defense program costs were \$177,434 for 32 member incidents requiring consultation.


